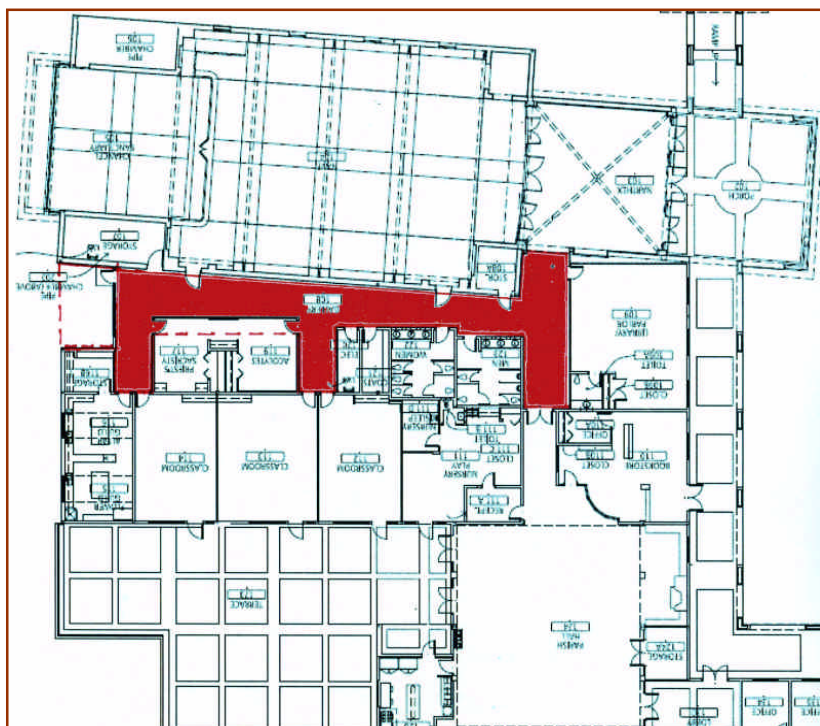
The Consecration of St. George's Episcopal Church

## COMMEMORATIVE ICON POSTER AVAILABLE *(from previous page)*

- The first run will be 150 copies. We are holding the first 75 copies of this first run exclusively for St. George's parishioners. We will be offering this poster for sale, also, from copies number 76 and following, at next week's Antiques Arcade, so be sure to reserve your copy now. (This announcement is being printed in hard copy and will be sent to all parishioners without email.)
- A copy of the poster may be seen this Sunday after all three services, and in the office after that. It is from an icon specially commissioned as a memorial to long time parishioner Betty McCall, by her family. The icon itself will be carried in the procession at the consecration of the new church on December 1, and placed in the lighted niche at the front of the church during the service.
- The cost in the first run is \$75 each, unframed. The size is 28 x 22 inches (standard frameable poster size). Orders may be placed by contacting the church office at 901 754-7282 / [communications@stgeorgesgermantown.org](mailto:communications@stgeorgesgermantown.org). Printing is authorized only as funds are received, so payment for the poster must accompany orders placed, within a day. Availability is on first come, first served, basis.
- A second run might be made later, labeled "Second edition," at a slightly lower price, from numbers 151 and following. The second run will not be commissioned until the first run is completely sold.
- In addition, we have an arrangement with Collierville framing company Tadporters, Michael Johnson, owner, who has kindly offered to provide a variety of framing styles to those interested, for at a discounted rate of 20% for any framing in the shop. ([www.tadporters.com](http://www.tadporters.com)) We are grateful for their support.
- The proceeds from sales of the poster will go to the new Gallery Committee of the church,\* Missy George, Chair. The section in red in the graphic below is the new Gallery space. An excerpt from Vestry minutes about the Gallery describes this program.:



\* "At their regular monthly meeting on September 25, the Vestry, among other actions: Approved a new standing committee of the Vestry called "The Gallery Committee," the draft purpose of which "is to promote the role of the visual arts as they celebrate the full range of human spirituality locally, nationally and internationally." The goal for the committee is "to stimulate the production of art, and an appreciation of the humanizing role of art in daily life, throughout the community." The Rector appointed Missy George as Chair.

It is proposed that the committee will meet quarterly or more often as necessary; normally plan a year long schedule consisting in exhibits lasting an average of two months; and undertake work funded by grants and special contributions to promote the arts with special emphasis on children and local budding artists. " Other members of the Gallery Committee at this point are Ruth Dunning and Amy Morse.
